World Palliative Care Day 2025 has come to a successful conclusion

On October 11, 2025, the "World Palliative Care Day 2025" was held at the Department of Hospice and Palliative Care of Xi'an International Medical Center Hospital, focusing on the theme of "Fulfilling Commitments: Enjoyed by All", emphasizing the importance of palliative care as a fundamental part of the healthcare system of a civilized society, and calling on all countries to strengthen the promotion of palliative care, achieve the goal of universal access to palliative care, and promote the development of palliative care on a global scale.

Improve the service system, build a full-cycle health security network, and promote innovative models such as "five-bed linkage"; 3. Strengthen talent support, consolidate the foundation of career development, and build a professional and excellent care team. Truly achieve "universal enjoyment", so that every patient can say goodbye with dignity and tranquility, and contribute to the construction of a warmer and healthier China!



Professor Liu Ailan, deputy director and chief nurse of the Nursing Department of Shaanxi Cancer Hospital, standing member of the Hospice Care Committee of the Chinese Anti-Cancer Association, and chairman of the

Hospice Care Committee of the Shaanxi Nursing Society, interpreted the 2025 palliative care guidelines, including the following: Symptom control: For 13 types of symptoms such as pain and dyspnea, assessment tools, treatment principles, nursing points and precautions are provided, emphasizing individualized plans and non-pharmacological interventions. Comfortable care: Covering 10 nursing operations such as ward environment, oral cavity, and lying position, focusing on patient safety and experience, such as preventing pressure injuries, oral moisturizing and preventing aspiration. Psychological support: Pay attention to the psychological needs of patients and their families, provide death cognition guidance, grief counseling, and encourage family members to participate in care. She concluded that the new version of the guidelines marks our country's hospice care from pilot exploration to standardized and humanized stage, reflecting the transformation of the concept of "patient-centered", which not only focuses on symptom relief, but also pays more attention to the dignity of life and humanistic care, and provides more comprehensive and warm care support for terminally ill patients and their families.
